RESOLUTION SCHEDULING PUBLIC HEARING
ON PROPOSED LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2025
AMENDING CHAPTER 91 OF THE CORINTH TOWN CODE REGARDING OCCUPANCY OF
TRAVEL TRAILERS AND ITS ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS

WHEREAS, upon recommendation of the Town’s Code Enforcement Officer, the Town Board has prepared proposed Local Law No.: 1 of 2025 entitled, “A Local Law Amending Chapter 91 of the Corinth Town Code Regarding Occupancy of Travel Trailers and its Enforcement Provisions;” and

WHEREAS, adoption of this legislation is authorized by New York Municipal Home Rule Law §10; and

WHEREAS, Municipal Home Rule Law §20 requires the Town Board to hold a Public Hearing prior to the adoption of any Local Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Corinth Town Board shall meet and hold a Public Hearing beginning at the Corinth Town Hall, 600 Palmer Avenue, Corinth, New York, beginning at 6:00 p.m. on October 9, 2025 to hear all interested persons and take any lawful action concerning proposed Local Law No.: 1 of 2025; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board further authorizes and directs the Corinth Town Clerk to publish and post a Notice of Public Hearing concerning proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2025 in the manner provided by law and to make a copy of the proposed Local Law available for public inspection in the Town Clerk’s office following the adoption of this Resolution and until the Public Hearing is closed.
