RESOLVED, that the Town of Corinth will apply for financial assistance from the New York Places for Learning, Activity, and Youth Socialization (NY PLAYS) grant opportunity, which is being overseen by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation and administered by the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York;

RESOLVED, that the Town of Corinth is authorized and directed to apply for an NY PLAYS grant in an amount between \$100,000 - \$2.5 million for the ongoing development of the Corinth Town Park, as described in the grant application;

RESOLVED, that the Town will provide at least a 20% match of the Capital Costs of the Project from other committed funding sources.

RESOLVED, that this project will not have the same scope as the Town's previously submitted Municipal Parks and Recreation grant; and

RESOLVED, that the governing body of the municipality delegates signing authority to execute the Contract and any amendments thereto, any required deed of easement, and any other certifications to the individual who holds the following elected or appointed municipal office and employment position title: Town Supervisor.
